Tioseco earned her Medical Doctor degree at the University of the East Philippines, Manila, Philippines, and her undergraduate degree at the University of Toronto, Ontario, Canada. She did her residency at Jersey Shore University Medical Center, Neptune, New Jersey. She is certified by the American Board of Pediatrics and has a subspecialty certificate in neonatal-perinatal Medicine. Tioseco did neonatology fellowships at Children's National Medical Center, Washington, DC and St. Peter's University Hospital, New Brunswick, New Jersey.

Tioseco has written and spoken extensively about prenatal and newborn issues ranging from infant nutrition to the effect of gender on jaundice. Her work has been published in *Pediatric and Critical Journal*, *Journal of Perinatology* and other journals. She addressed the *Journal of Perinatology* 2005 National Conference and Exhibition Section on Perinatal Pediatrics.

Tioseco and her husband Jose Mendoza, MD, an obstetrician at ARMC's Center for Childbirth, live in Atlantic City with their two children.
