AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center City Campus continues artists exhibition *Linwood artist with an appetite for still life featured through September*

AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center (ARMC) City Campus continues its local artists exhibition. The featured artist through September is Chuck Law of Linwood, New Jersey. The display *Scatter Paintings* is from a collection of still life oil paintings featuring food-friendly titles including “Raspberries and Meringues” and “Salt Water Taffy.”



In *Scatter Paintings*, “objects are placed on a flat surface, sometimes randomly, more often with careful orchestration to create a strong visual rhythm,” explains Chuck Law.

Primarily a still life painter, Law also expresses himself through plein air (painting outdoors), landscape, marine art and animal paintings. Law is a signature artist member of the Noyes Museum of Art, in Oceanville, New Jersey, a member of the Ocean City Arts Center in Ocean City, New Jersey, the Cape May County Art League and the Society of New Jersey Artists.

Scatter Paintings will remain on display at ARMC City Campus’s new George F. Lynn Harmony Pavilion through the month of September. The exhibit - located in the second floor corridor off the main lobby entrance- is one of several that ARMC is featuring through its Healing Arts Program that highlight the work of New Jersey artists.

AtlantiCare has made a commitment to dedicate one percent of all new building costs to the arts, based on research that shows visual arts and music can aid the healing process. More than 500 pieces of art decorate patient, staff and family areas of the new George F. Lynn Harmony Pavilion. Through ARMC’s Healing Arts Program, the public has the

opportunity to sponsor art as an option for contributing to the AtlantiCare Foundation, which raises funds for ARMC programs and services.
