2025-2026 GRANT GUIDELINES

Since 2005, AtlantiCare has been partnering with area schools to improve the health and wellness of staff, students and their families, with a vision of building a healthier community. In the 2025-2026 school year, AtlantiCare Healthy Schools, Healthy Children will award funding opportunities to partnered schools to promote the adoption and sustainability of wellness actions that align with AtlantiCare's strategic community initiatives.



AVAILABLE FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES

The following funding opportunities will grant dollars to schools to initiate or sustain ongoing wellness activities within the school setting. One-day health fairs or one-day events will not be permitted, as AtlantiCare is only funding ongoing activities and/or programming that will result in long-lasting behavioral changes and/or policy or environmental changes that align with the grant actions noted in their application. Schools are eligible to apply for financial support for the *AED Heart Heroes Program and/or one of the grant offerings listed on the menu below. Actions are to focus on nutrition, physical activity, and/or emotional well-being or substance use prevention. Please use the menu below to identify actions eligible for funding.



AED HEART HEROES PROGRAM

The AtlantiCare Heart Heroes is an AtlantiCare Foundation-funded program that places AEDs in the community on behalf of the Heart & Vascular Institute at AtlantiCare Regional Medical Center. Schools that have not already received one in a previous year can apply to receive a new AED with the AtlantiCare Healthy Schools Grant covering the total cost.

\$1000 Hydration Station Grant

New or replacement water bottle filling station supplies, plumbing, and installation services.

BUILDING RESILIENCY AND SUBSTANCE USE PREVENTION

In an attempt to prioritize impact in the areas of mental health and substance use, AtlantiCare Healthy Schools, Healthy Children seeks to assist schools in developing youth resiliency through social-emotional competency, substance use resistance, and emotional wellbeing. These grant opportunities will assist schools with the identification, implementation, and sustainability of proven social-emotional learning (SEL) and substance use prevention programs.

SCHOOL ATTENDANCE - Up to \$1000

If your school is working towards improving student and/or staff attendance during the school day, you may apply for our new School Attendance Grant. This grant will provide funding to enhance your current attendance initiatives already in place at your school or to implement new initiatives to promote the importance and excitement of coming to school each day. If awarded, you must provide attendance rates from the 24-25 school year, list what your school is currently doing and/or will do to improve attendance, and provide updated attendance rates upon submission of your Grant Report. SPECIAL REQUEST - Up to \$1000

If your school is requesting funding to support a specific action that does not fall under one of the above categories, but is still related to student, staff, or overall school wellness, you may apply for a Special Request Grant. Please contact a member of the Healthy Schools team at healthyschools@atlanticare.org to review your proposal with the following information: a brief summary of your special grant request, the target population(s), the total requested dollars, and a detailed budget breakdown in dollar amount. (Ex: Clothing closet for students or CPR certifications for staff)

HOW TO APPLY

Step 1: School Health Survey Due: November 21, 2025

*The school health survey is a tool to identify areas where funding may support valuable actions promoting school health.

Step 2: Grant Application Due: December 5, 2025

*The grant application will outline the scope, outcomes, actions, budget and more, of your proposed project.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

If awarded, the school is required to send at least one representative to our mandatory grant award workshop to learn about relevant topics that impact school health, gardening instruction, program details and reporting expectations. The workshop information is below.

Applicant must agree to an AtlantiCare site visit, if requested, to view your school's wellness efforts.

All grant dollars are to be used for education, activities and support materials. If at any time, AtlantiCare feels that the grant dollars are not being used appropriately, AtlantiCare has the right to request a refund of all monetary awards.

Awarded schools are required to submit a <u>grant report</u> completed in its entirety, including the appropriate supporting materials, no later than **May 15, 2026**.

Late submission of required documentation could jeopardize future eligibility for AtlantiCare Healthy Schools, Healthy Children funding opportunities.

Schools may only submit **one** grant application per school.
